# UT Ultimate tours by Sakertours

• Rebooting the Sakertours hide network in the second half of 2021 was a priority for us! Several hides had to be renovated or replaced as even though there were no clients the weather was just as harsh as usual. We are still working on our hides in Romania which were a bit more effected however our hide network in the Hortobágy National Park is ready for the next season.

Our main goal for 2022 is to welcome you with the usual hide variety and comfort!

• Beside all the **restoration works** we would like to open a new Bear Photography hide in Transylvania. The hide will be ready by Spring 2022. In certain part of the year this hide will be used for other subjects such as Red Deers and raptors like Golden Eagle and Goshawk in winter besides beeing a Brown Bear Photo Hide.

It will also be possible to sleep in this hide as an option.

• Eurasian Lynx Photography Tour - a very special and a brand-new photography tour in Transylvania where we try to stalk and photograph the `ghost of the forest` in late winter during their mating period. You will have 5 full days for the Lynx operation in temporary blinds, natural shelters and stalking with the help of our expert guide. You can find more information under this LINK

We have been visiting many locations in our region and gained valuable information of seeing some of the special butterflies. • The biggest progress achieved by Sakertours team (logistics and field work) however during the Covid pandemic period was launching **Mammal Watching Tours**. There is an increasing interest for mammals and we are aeger to guide you for our special Eastern European specialties.

We currently offer three different Mammal Tours for 2022:

- (1) Eurasian Lynx Tour in Transylvania between 5-11 March, 2022. A specialized tour in search for the Eurasian Lynx in the Carpathian Forest. Before this new tour came out, we have tested the program in March 2021. We will see many tracks and with patience and good technical background we have good chance of finding this enigmatic mammal on our tour.
- (2) Romania Mammal Tour between 26 August 3 September, 2022. Sakertours very best mammal watching tour in Romania where we will cover the Carpathian Mountains and the Danube Delta. On this tour we have recorded 48 species in 2020 and 49 species in 2021. This is a blockbuster tour if you want to start your mammal list or you are visiting Europe for mammals. It was designed to see as many mammals within a mere 9 days as possible.
- (3) European Mink Special between 9-13 September, 2022. A specialized short mammal watching tour to look for the critically endangered European Mink in the Danube Delta. Our 2021 tour was a great success, seeing the European Mink again!

# **↓** HIDE PHOTOGRAPHY IN THE HORTOBÁGY NATIONAL PARK

The year of 2021 was a slow recovery. After a depressing 12 months the beginning of the year was still a challenge!

In spring only a limited number of guests could reach us but just as in 2020 by summer the politicians decided we are free to travel! If you have been vaccinated you can go with various minor restrictions. So from late June and July we had a few foreign visitors after a long gap!

The second half of the year we saw continuous improvement in travelling.

Winter Eagle Photography in the Hortobágy National Park was very exciting but only local photographers could enjoy it. White-tailed Eagles were regular subjects in front of our hides but Long-legged Buzzard, Saker Falcon, Eastern Imperial Eagle and both Common and Roughlegged Buzzards had visited our feeding station.

The **Spring-Summer** vibes were again fantastic but only for limited number of photographers. Our shorebird hide performed well and all the well know hides were very reliable.

The Egret and Stork Hide was a great favorite beside the Red-footed Falcon tower hide. Plus the usual colorful friends like Hoopoe, Roller and Bee-eater where there to satisfy the photographers in our hides.

The Autumn **Crane Photography** tours were just fantastic.

We have expanded our Crane hide network and 2021 autumn was a dry period allowing great Crane photography possibilities!

We have a well elaborated 1 day Crane Photography tour now on our website and for foreign visitors we suggest to book several days of this! Every day is different, especially in the roosting Crane Hides.

In this place Cranes are spending the night and the photography is taking place in the early hours when the birds are starting to leave the roosting site.

The atmosphere here is fantastic. We also used our fixed drinking and bathing Crane hides, plus used temporary hides and found perfect places to capture Cranes in the sunset.


All the locations were continuously changing throughout the season. The Hortobágy is ever changing!

# ↓ HIDE PHOTOGRAPHY IN THE DANUBE DELTA

In 2021 the situation in the Danube Delta was similar to Hungary. We only had few guests because the vaccination was slow, but by early summer we could organize few tours with our special photo boat.

The result was excellent as always. Our well known places worked well and had some really nice experiences with every group.

Red-necked Grebe families in the soft evening light, fishing and preening Pelicans, Glossy Ibises in the open, fishing Purple-, Squacco- and Night Herons, Whiskered Terns with nesting materials were amongst the main highlights in 2021. The Hotel garden in the Delta produced such surprises like breeding Little Owl, Hoppoe, Red-footed Falcon and Penduline Tit. We can't wait to return again in 2022 and see what we can find!

Over the summer our team member, Daniel Balla has found a decent breeding colony of Rose-coloured Starlings in Dobrudja. About 2000 pairs were breeding in an active rock quarry. Seeing and photographing breeding Rosy Starlings as they hunt for grasshoppers is a fantastic experience for a wildlife photographer. We would love to see them every year but their breeding in the region is very hectic and unpredictible.

Last time they bred was back in 2018!

If you would like to join a bird photography tour to the Danube Delta we still have available places! On the classic Danube Delta photo tour we are visiting three places and cover a larger area of coastal Dobrudja plus have 3 days in the Danube Delta with our special photo boat. The Danube Delta Special tours are 1 night shorter and only visiting the Danube Delta with our photo boat between the end of June - and mid July. 

# ↓ Brown Bear and Bird photography in Transylvania, Romania

In Transylvania we have started the season with the Western Capercaillies at a lekking site. That was a very nice experience in the deep snow and it worked until the first week of May.

We had breeding Dippers and a Ural Owl pair in our special nest boxes built for them. The first attempt of the Urals Owls has failed, as none of the eggs have hatched, but they tried again later and successfully raised one chick.

Red Squirrel photography was fantastic throughout the year!

We have a whole bunch of Red Squirrels in front of our forest feeding station. Great fun to captre and `freeze` the movement when jumping.

All the three Brown Bear photography hides worked well between April and October.

Late Summer and Autumn Bear photography tours were all successful. A mother Bear with 4 cubs was a highlight in front of the so called 'stream' hide. In that place a second mother Bear with two cubs was also often visible, so some lucky guest could see them all in one place.

Nice memories indeed!

Beside the Bears we often had Red Foxes and different kind of birds including Stock Dove, Wood Pigeon, Raven, Jay, Mallard, Grey Wagtail...


In late September a young Lesser Spotted Eagle appeared in front of the stream hide.

We were hopeing to see Hazel Grouse again in front of the hides but we only came across them on the way to the hides or back to the Lodge, mainly along forestry roads.

#### **↓** BIRDWATCHING TOURS IN **2021**

We would like to share the main highlights from all our birding tours from the past season.

- Danube Delta Spring Tour: This tour was run with an improved itinerary and it was a very enjoyable trip with such goodies seen like Semi-Collared Flycatcher, Pallid Swift, Paddyfield Warbler, Pied Wheatear, Saker Falcon, Pallas's Gull, Broad-billed Sandpiper, Rose-coloured Starling to name just a few. We have recorded 178 species! Read the trip report under this LINK
- Danube Delta Autumn Tour: A very productive tour which covers the best places for migratory birds in South East Romania. Tour highlights were Levant Sparrowhawks, Greater Flamingos, Pallas's Gulls, Black-winged and Collared Pratincoles, Broad-billed Sandpipers, Paddyfield Warbler, Pied Wheatear. We have recorded 179 species! Read the trip report under this LINK
- Red-breasted Goose Special Tour in the Hortobágy National Park was successful with many excellent looks of the two main targets: Red-breasted and Lesser Whitefronted Geese! Additional supporting cast included many Eastern Imperial Eagles, Greater Spotted Eagle, Long-legged Buzzard, Saker, Great Bustard and various passerines
- In November during a synchronised Geese count a record number of 210 LWG were counted in the Hortobágy National Park! See you next year!

# MAMMAL WATCHING TOURS IN 2021

- Romania Mammal Tour. After a successful inaugural tour in 2020 we repeated this tour in 2021 with Zoltan Gergely Nagy as principal guide. The tour was successful again and the group recorded 49 species with highlights inclluding Romanian Hamster, Wildcat, Brown Bear, Lesser Blind Mole Rat, Bechstein's Bat and Kuhl's Pipistrelle. - European Mink Special Tour in the Danube Delta. It was our first dedicated European Mink tour to the Danube Delta and was successful. We managed to find and observe a European Mink very well and 31 species of mammals during the tour. Success!
